Below is a selection of the main Indo-European (IE) roots.

The words akin to the IE root are split by languages with a “/” following the order:
Sanskrit/Greek/Latin/French/Spanish/English/German

In cases of split etymologic chains, the sequence is repeated with a jump to the next line.

Occasionally, Chinese characters have been proposed when offering a good match, both semantically and phonetically.

Double vowels indicate the long vowels In Sanskrit, and “oo” for the Greek omega, “ee” for the e with accent. Ae is used for the German ä.
